What is the setting?

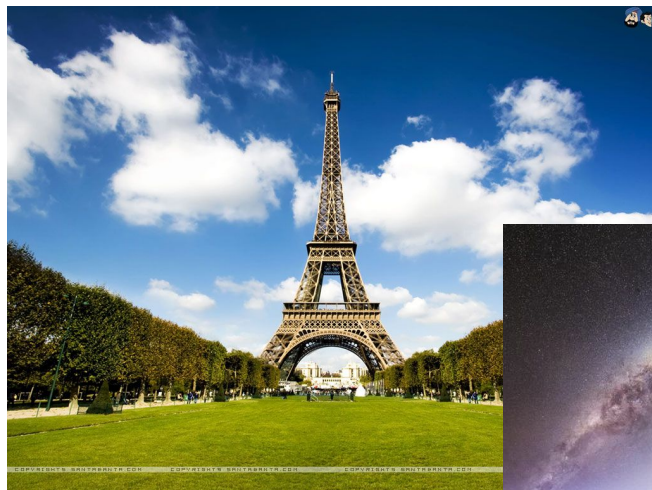
- The **time** and **place** where a story happens

The setting helps to create the mood of the story. It influences how readers feel about the text.







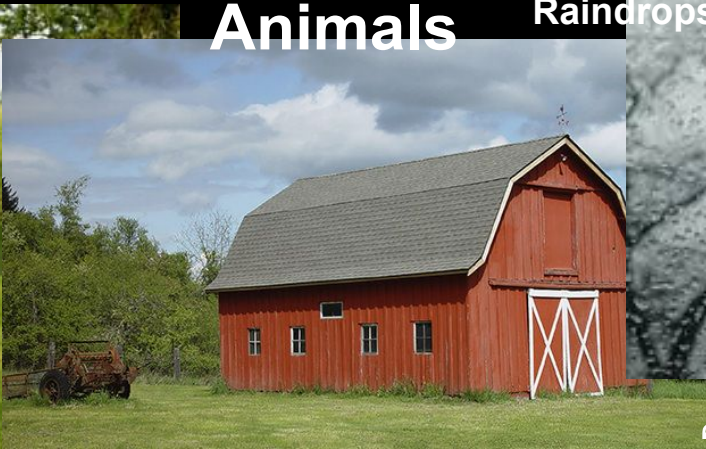




Knowing the setting helps you visualize the text, even when there aren't pictures.

- Descriptive words can help us figure out the setting of a story.
